Key Activities

- Prevent and reduce STI/HIV transmission and STI/HIV-related morbidity, mortality in WSR II by providing primitive, preventive and curative services specified according to the needs of the respective target groups.
- 2. HIV awareness raising, health education and behavioral change communication among sex workers, rubber plantation, mobile workers, truck drivers, most at risk youth,

uniformed personnel through peer educations and outreach workers

- 3. Referral to voluntary and confidential HIV testing services
- 4. Condom promotion and distribution among vulnerable groups
- Increase access to diagnosis and treatment of sexually transmitted diseases among rubber plantation and migrant workers
- 6. Increase access to treatment of opportunistic infections, antiretroviral therapy and home based care for people living with HIV
- 7. Capacity building on HIV related issues for Wa health staff professional
- Reduce STIs-HIV related risk, vulnerability and impact among sex workers and other Sexual Partners, institutional populations, truck drivers, uniformed services personnel, young people and partners and families of PLWHA
- 9. Provide comprehensive care, support and treatment on STI/HIV (such as ART, OI treatment, HBC, supports for hospitalization, nutrition) to PLHIV and their family
- 10. Enhance the capacity of Wa Health professional to deal with the HIV/AIDS pandemic
