#### The Problem:

- Parent Voices sponsored the screening of "La Mission," a homosexual propaganda movie, which was viewed at an LGBT center.
- Parent Voices boasts its membership on the Coordinating Committee (the decision making body) of the proabortion, pro-homosexual California Partnership.

#### The Response:

After contacting the local diocese with initial findings in July, American Life League received a statement on 4 September saying "Our intent is to respond as soon as possible to the information you include in your letter." As of 1 October, ALL has received no such response.

ALL scheduled a meeting with the Executive Director of National CCHD to discuss the report. The meeting was subsequently cancelled by CCHD with the explanation, "we see no reason to meet at this time."





#### February 2011 CAP Health Care Policy Update

The New Year began with the GOP vowing to repeal health care reform. The attempt was mainly symbolic (demonstrated with their two-page repeal bill). Yet it served to mark the beginning of many attempts to dismantle the Affordable Care Act (ACA) both fiscally or through the courts. Shocking however is the introduction of H.R. 3 (Smith), which seeks to rewrite the rules for reproductive services.

The abortion restriction already in the ACA, does not allow a woman receiving federally subsidized health coverage to obtain any <u>abortion</u> services under that coverage. H.R. 3 goes even further to deny tax credits to employers who purchase plans that might provide these services as part of their overall benefits package. Even if <u>abortion</u> services were paid entirely out-of-pocket and no federal dollars were used, a woman would no longer be eligible to receive subsidies if her coverage plan included <u>reproductive</u> services.



Our members of congress must be told that this type of legislation is unacceptable.

Senator Barbara Boxer is leading the charge against H.R. 3, drafting a letter to colleagues condemning the bill. We need to show our support by thanking her for her efforts and sharing our opposition.

#### Dear Speaker Boehner:

As organizations committed to ensuring that quality health care is affordable and available in communities across the country, we are writing to strongly urge you to abandon ideologically-driven efforts focused on undermining women's access to Planned Parenthood health centers.

For over 90 years, Planned Parenthood has served as an invaluable community-based health care provider, offering routine examinations, cancer screenings, immunizations, contraceptive services, and HIV and STI testing and treatment. Today, 850 Planned Parenthood health centers provide primary and preventive health care to 3 million Americans every year. For many Americans, Planned Parenthood is their sole source of health care.

It's clear that there is a cynical and coordinated effort afoot designed to undermine this essential health care provider. Both political organizations and members of Congress have made defunding Planned Parenthood and other women's health care providers a top legislative priority. These efforts will have a real-life devastating impact on the health of millions of Americans. Playing politics with Americans' health is simply unacceptable.

We represent a broad range of organizations, but we are bound by a commitment to ensuring all Americans—including American women—can access the care they need to lead healthy and productive lives. We strongly urge you to focus on the issues Americans care about most, and reject these ideological attacks that take health care away from Americans.
