
ONE Northside has key staff members who are committed to the promotion of homosexual and transgender ideologies as well as the promotion of "reproductive Justice" Additionally, ONE Northside has itself promoted homosexual and transgender ideologies, and is a member of several organizations (in direct violation of CCHD grant guidelines) that are radically proabortion and pro-LGBTQ.

On <u>June 28, 2020</u>, ONE Northside co-hosted "Pride Without Prejudice" March, spotlighting transgender activism. The write-up on the event reads, in part:


"We will unapologetically highlight issues of racism, police violence, and the obscene amount of money spent on a militarized police, and a military which polices the world. In so doing, we will be honoring the rich, but largely forgotten history of the Stonewall Rebellion and the movement that followed it.

Not only was Stonewall a rebellion against police violence, fighting racism was also a core principle of the movement that came immediately after it. **Our early LGBTQ movement** organized many actions against racism and police violence in solidarity with the Black Panther Party, leading the BPP to become the first large "non-LGBTQ" organization to embrace what at the time was called "**gay liberation.**"

Advertising the event, ONE Northside wrote, "Remember to join us today at Pride Without Prejudice! Happy PRIDE to our incredible and powerful queer leaders and supporters!!"



On October 1, 2020, ONE Northside advertised for the "Trans Visibility March," calling for followers to "turn out if you can!"

As the saying goes, "Personnel is policy," which is why ONE Northside's push for transgender ideologies shouldn't be too much of a surprise. Several of its key staff members are LGBTQ activists, who also advocate for contraception and "reproductive justice."

former "sex-ed teacher," who is "committed to building a queer multiracial movement to win a caring universal healthcare system."




## ELEANA MOLISE

On a facebook post from <u>Jacobin Magazine from Feb. 2017</u>, Molise said, "That's fantastic" in response to a comment about having people donate to abortion clinics in direct relation to the number of pro-life demonstrators who show up.



In <u>July 2019</u>, Molise posted a picture of herself saying, "Me, looking down on straight ppl who go to pride to party but don't do any tangible work to advance the rights of queer and trans people. It's queer wrath month y'all- get ready!!!!"



In November 2018, Molise posted an ad for a "Trans Day of Remembrance" film titled, "Call

Her Ganda," calling the film and event "so so important."



## **ONE Northside Membership in People's Action Institute**

The CCHD absolutely forbids organizations from membership in organizations acting against Catholic teaching. In an <u>FAQ on the USCCB website</u>, the CCHD directly answers the question about whether grantees may be members of coalitions that oppose Catholic teachings. In answer, the CCHD firmly stated, "CCHD will not fund groups that are knowingly members of coalitions that have as part of their organizational purpose or coalition agenda, positions or actions that contradict fundamental Catholic moral and social teaching."

# What about participation in coalitions for a good purpose, like better wages or housing, that include groups acting against Catholic values on other issues?

CCHD encourages groups to work across geographical, racial, ethnic, economic, and ideological lines to overcome poverty and advance the common good. However, CCHD will not fund groups that are knowingly members of coalitions that have as part of their organizational purpose or coalition agenda, positions or actions that contradict fundamental Catholic moral and social teaching (e.g. promotion or support of abortion, same-sex marriage, euthanasia, racism, as well as the use of the death penalty punitive measures toward immigrants, etc.). Prohibited activities include participation in or endorsing actions that promote legislation, and ballot initiatives (including voter guides and other written materials) that contradict Catholic moral or social teaching.

Given this, there is no excuse for ONE Northside to be a member of the People's Action Institute (PAI). And even though its members page contains a disclaimer which says that the "Member organizations are independent and affiliation does not imply agreement or participation in all of the positions or programs of People's Action Institute," the disclaimer does no good to protect the organization from the CCHD guideline prohibiting membership in such groups, especially since PAI affiliates pay dues to the organization.





On page 9 of PIA's 2019 tax form 990, organizational members of People's Action Institute pay annual dues to the organization.



As far back as 2012, the People's Action Institute has been advocating for abortion and birth control. In May of 2012, PAI posted an image of Socialist Bernie Sanders and his cry "we're not going back" regarding women's access to birth control and abortion. PAI said, in regard to Sanders' message, "Click LIKE & SHARE if you agree with Bernie Sanders - 'we are not going back'!"



In September of 2018, PAI posted a call to have Bret Kavanaugh voted down as a candidate for

the Supreme Court saying, "We won't go back to a world without safe, legal abortion."



In March of 2019, PAI published its "<u>Healthcare For All Platform</u>," which demanded that all attempts to obstruct access to abortion be stopped, completely.

## **OUR HEALTH CARE SYSTEM IN CRISIS**

Our current healthcare system is driven by profit and governed by insurance and pharmaceutical companies, rather than by the people. In calling for **Improved Medicare for All** we are fighting to shift power from corporations and the 1 percent (insurance & drug corporations), move health care resources into the public sphere (and people into public coverage), increase community control, and combat exclusion on the basis of race, gender, citizenship status, age, and ability. We must directly counter the racialized vilification of public programs and challenge narrative frameworks that view anyone as undeserving of care. And we must move towards the realization of the sovereign treaty right to health care for American Indians. Fighting for universal health care allows us to put corporate power, immigrant exclusion, and racial and gender inequity at the center of the debate.

#### **HEALTHCARE IS A HUMAN RIGHT & A PUBLIC GOOD**

We will know we have won when health care is:

- √ For health, not profit
- ✓ Simple, universal, and available
- √ Fully resourced
- Equitable across race, gender, ability, and region
- Delivered by health care workers who are fairly and fully compensated for their labor

 Inclusive and comprehensive (including medicines, medical equipment, vision/dental/hearing care, reproductive care, mental health care, harm reduction and treatment for substance misuse, preventive care, and long-term care and home care)

# PROTECTING EXISTING FEDERAL HEALTH PROGRAMS AND FUNDING

 We must prevent the repeal or replacement of the Affordable Care Act, in part or in full, both in Congress and the court system.



We must prevent budget cuts to Medicare, Medicaid, the Child Health Insurance Program (CHIP), the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), and Social Security, and fight for full funding of these vital programs as core components of our established health care infrastructure.

We must stop all attempts to prevent vulnerable communities and populations from accessing federally funded health care through changes to eligibility requirements, such as citizenship status, or covered services, particularly reproductive health care and access to abortion.

On <u>June 24, 2022</u>, the very day the Supreme Court ruled to overturn Roe v. Wade, People's Action issued a press release calling the landmark ruling a "direct assault on our people's freedom to make decisions about what's best for them." People's Action then vowed to "fight back," saying:

"Access to abortion care is central to protecting our bodily autonomy, health care, privacy, and freedom. Anti-abortion legislation is not pro-life: it's pro-white supremacy and anti-democratic.

"We need to defend our democracy and protect our people. At People's Action, we're leading an organizing revival to build a government for us and led by us, the multiracial, poor and working class. This ruling only fuels our righteous rage and determination to fight back."

## Conclusion

ONE Northside has directly promoted transgender ideologies, which clearly fits the mold of the ideology of organization itself, which is staffed with LGBTQ activists. Additionally, ONE Northside is a dues-paying member of the radically pro-abortion People's Action Institute in direct violation of CCHD grant guidelines.
