Women's Community Revitalization Project

The Women's Community Revitalization Project (WCRP) was a long-time grantee of the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) that lost its funding in 2013 due to some of our previous reports. This funding was restored in 2019, bringing WCRP's total funds since 2006 to \$315,000, including the \$45,000 it received from the CCHD for FY 2020-2021.



In the previous report on WCRP, the Reform CCHD Now Coalition showed that WCRP had an intimate relationship with the radically pro-abortion "Women's Way" (Women's Way only gave grants to organizations that professed a commitment to "reproductive freedom"), was a duespaying member of the pro-abortion and pro-LGBT National Committee for Responsive Philanthropy, and that the executive director, Nora Lichtash, is an LGBTQ activist.

Nora Lichtash is still the executive director for WCRP, as <u>indicated here</u>.



In 2016, Lichtash conducted an interview with the The Laura Flanders Show, wherein she admitted that she lost funding (at the 5:35 mark) "from a pretty major organizing funding source because I'm a lesbian." Considering the fact that WCRP stopped receiving CCHD funds in 2013, and those funds weren't resumed until recently, it stands to reason that she is talking about the CCHD.



In addition to the pro-LGBTQ activism that Lichtash has done, as indicated in the Reform CCHD Now report, Lichtash is still actively combating the Church's moral teachings. In <u>June of 2021</u>, she donated to Planned Parenthood.



Since 1990, Nora Lichtash has served as executive director of the Women's Community Revitalization Project, the multi-racial community development organization committed to providing economic and social equity for low-income women and their families. Most recently, the group has been organizing to ensure that long-term residents have the ability to not be pushed out of housing due to high costs. As part of this work, they have created the Community Justice Land Trust.
